**The Nicene Creed**  
*We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.*  
*We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. Comfort and heal all those who suffer in body, mind, or spirit; give them courage and hope in their troubles, and bring them the joy of your salvation.

We commend to your mercy all who have died, that your will for them may be fulfilled; and we pray that we may share with all your saints in your eternal kingdom.

We pray to you also for the forgiveness of our sins.

*A period of silence is kept.*

*Leader and People*

*Then the Celebrant continues*

*Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.*

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

## GRACE CHURCH’S MISSION STATEMENT

To grow in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ, and through His Grace,  
to make disciples of ourselves and others.

### PHILOSOPHY OF MINISTRY

TEN OPERATING CONVICTIONS FOR

“STEP-BY-STEP: MAKING ROOM FOR MAKING DISCIPLES”

- 1) FACILITIES FACILITATE. They are means to the end of making disciples.
- 2) ONLY PEOPLE ARE ETERNAL. All buildings, whether cathedrals or Quonset huts, are “temporary” solutions to temporal needs.
- 3) THERE ARE NO SPARE PARTS IN THE BODY OF CHRIST. Every member ministry is oxymoronic since we are all members of a body, not a bureaucracy, of an organism, not an organization.
- 4) IT IS ONLY WHEN CHURCH MEMBERS STOP SEEING THEMSELVES AS CONSUMERS OF A PRODUCT AND BEGIN TO SEE THEMSELVES AS OWNERS AND MISSIONERS THAT TRUE MINISTRY STARTS TO TAKE PLACE.
- 5) THE WORD “CHURCH” LITERALLY MEANS “BELONGING TO THE LORD.” This is His stuff, not ours.
- 6) WHEN A CHURCH STOPS MOVING AHEAD, IT STOPS BEING THE CHURCH. The Great Commission begins with a participle and an imperative: “As you go, make disciples . . .” The imperative is “Make disciples.” “Moving ahead” is the necessary prerequisite.
- 7) THE GREAT COMMISSION IS BOTH SACRAMENTAL AND DIDACTIC. How does one make disciples? “Baptizing them . . . and teaching them . . .”
- 8) AS A PROTESTANT CHURCH, THE ANGLICAN CHURCH WAS FOUNDED TO DO AT LEAST THREE THINGS:
  - 1) to clarify issues of spiritual and ecclesiastical authority,
  - 2) to reform the church, conforming it to biblical standards,
  - 3) to make the Word of God and the worship of God available to all people.
- 9) THE CHURCH IS A HOSPITAL FOR SINNERS, NOT A HOTEL FOR SAINTS. Corollary: THE CHURCH IS A HOSPITAL FOR SINNERS, NOT A NURSING HOME. We expect that hurting people will be healed and, in due course, will actively contribute to the life and ministry of the church.
- 10) IF A CHURCH DOESN’T HAVE ENOUGH MONEY, IT MAY BE BECAUSE IT’S NOT GIVING ENOUGH AWAY. Loving our neighbor as we do ourselves implies that one goal of discipleship should be to spend as much on others as we do on ourselves. The Church exists primarily for those outside it.
